The first Advent season came into the everyday world of a people who were trying to survive the domination of the Roman Empire. There came a time of great hope and anticipation that God was about to act. John the Baptist declared a message of preparation. The people needed to prepare to recognize and experience the action of God in their midst. This message will be the four week focus of Advent. How do you and I prepare each day to recognize and experience the action of God in our midst? What spiritual disciplines will you and I practice and acquire this month to better prepare us for the excitement of God?

December ends with the jubilation of Christmas. December is a busy month indeed! We have much to prepare for, a great deal to celebrate!
